	Mr McArthur went into 5 China St to get Vaughan, who was inside, to leave. There was an argument but Vaughan started to go out.	
Mr Egar states he heard Mr McArthur shouting at King 'he started it' a couple of times. Page 7, red highlight.  Vaughan inadvertently admitted in court that he 'had a go at' Mr McArthur.	As Vaughan got to the door Mr McArthur insulted Vaughan who turned and struck Mr McArthur in the chest.	
Mr Ellis states that he saw Vaughan (the taller man) being pushed out of the door backwards. Page 10, blue highlight.	Mr McArthur pushed Vaughan out of the door backwards with the intention of restraining him after this assault.	
Mr Ellis describes both Mr McArthur and Vaughan as falling heavily against a vehicle. Page 10, green highlight.	Mr McArthur caused Vaughan to topple over bringing both of them to the ground.	
	Mr McArthur then sat on Vaughan to restrain him. Vaughan was lying in position A on the diagram on page 14.	
	King then grabbed Mr McArthur from behind and then yanked him to the right causing him to fall to the ground. As he fell Mr McArthur was aware that if Vaughan got up first and King was holding him then he would be in a very vulnerable position.	

<p>Dr Morris describes injuries that are consistent with only one blow being struck. Page 9.</p>	<p>To make sure Mr McArthur had the chance to get up first he lashed out at Vaughan as he fell striking him once. The intention was to shock Vaughan and give Mr McArthur time to get up first.</p>	
	<p>Mr McArthur was able to get up first but was annoyed at being caught up in this situation, and jabbed Vaughan once with his foot.</p>	
<p>Mr Eger describes this. Page 7.</p>	<p>Mr McArthur was standing over Vaughan when Mr Egar came out. King pulled Mr McArthur round so he was facing North, away from Vaughan. Mr Egar then went in to call the police.</p>	
	<p>Vaughan then got up, followed track 2 on the diagram, page 14, and came at Mr McArthur again. Mr McArthur then put Vaughan on the floor again.</p>	
<p>Lisa Stephens states that Mr McArthur was holding Vaughan's head, and that Vaughan's head was against the pavement. Page 12, yellow highlight.</p>	<p>Mr McArthur then sat on Vaughan again, with a hand on Vaughan's head.</p>	
	<p>Mr McArthur was then pulled off Vaughan again by King. By this time Mr Ellis and Ms Stephens were arriving and the incident ended.</p>
